There is an opportunity to help make Wooten Park better on Saturday, October 23rd beginning at 8:00 am. The last work day was in the heat of August, but the sodded berm from that work day is redirecting rain and doing its job.

This work day in the cool of autumn will also invite the Wooten parents with a flyer that went home the week of October 11. It is my hope that Wooten residents will join with all the volunteers in the park.

We will build the raised beds of limestone blocks and work on a retaining wall. We will be planting trees, shrubs and plants that Redeemer has tended for more than a year. And we will work on the granite path.

So other than eager bodies ready to work, you can bring shovels and rakes for the planting and beds and gloves for all work. Someone with a gas-powered weedwhacker and safety glasses could help with the grass that is encroaching on the path. Because the headline to this has the word

PARTY in it, we should celebrate the progress that is happening. I will bake a couple batches of cookies and maybe other food will be your contribution to this work PARTY.

What is Wooten Neighborhood Association?

What do houses in Sunset View, North Plains, Dixie Terrace, Wooten Terrace, Lanier Terrace, Allendale North and Wooten Park have in common? If they are located within the right triangle defined by Anderson Lane, Burnet Road and 183 they are all within the boundaries for the Wooten Neighborhood Association.

As the city works to develop a new updated Comprehensive Plan with meetings in stages throughout the city for ease of citizen input, why should Wooten residents be involved in their neighborhood? The only places where no change seems to occur are either sections of towns that are designated historical or where the growth rate is stagnant. This is not the scenario for Austin's future.

In the recent election for officers we had about 50 paid members from our neighborhood eligible to vote and represent everyone in Wooten. Our Yahoo group has 160 members, but not all are residents of Wooten. The Facebook group has 66 members. So most residents of Wooten are not represented. Even this newsletter goes to only 1000 houses each quarter, which does not include everyone who lives in Wooten.

I have lived in the Wooten neighborhood for three years now and know that I certainly do not always have the full history of the neighborhood. But as the newly elected president, I want to encourage others

to help make Wooten a great place to call our home. Because the answer to what really makes up Wooten Neighborhood is the people who are our neighbors.

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Safety news

- Home safety was the subject of the Commander's Forum on Oct. 12. Statistics show decreases in most property crimes, but burglary of residences is still happening at about the same rate as last year. Wooten reported three residence burglaries: Exmoor (9-02), Kamar (9-13), and Ohlen (9-29). An attentive neighbor interrupted the Ohlen break-in by yelling at the thieves. Their driver raced away with his truck only partially loaded and without the remaining thieves, who dropped their stuffed pillow cases. She had noticed the suspicious black truck because it was parked in front of her house and had a loud muffler.
- Many surrounding neighborhoods are having great success with Neighborhood Watch Groups. Signs are posted throughout our neighborhood, but making this work takes neighbors to organize with Block Captains. If you are interested in making your section of the neighborhood a little safer, contact Joy Roberts <president@wootenna.com>.
- Dale Ritzen shares this encouraging follow-up to a break-in at his own house in May 2009: *"Take and keep pictures of everything inside and outside of your house that could possibly indicate criminal intent, because the police might not take pictures on the scene. Thanks to pictures we took of each room of our house before any clean-up, we were able to provide a picture of a "dusted" printer with fingerprints clearly showing*

all over it. The Travis County DA's office had one of the guys who had been involved and, with the hard evidence from the picture, hopes to move his charge from a "criminal trespass" misdemeanor to a "burglary of a residence" felony. And he might now be facing a few years behind bars instead of a just fine and short time served."
