As our fledgling neighborhood watch program finds its wings, it needs a new leader.

Founding chairman Burton Anderson is stepping down, so the watch committee is looking for someone (or a couple of someones) to lead this important effort.

This job can be as simple or as involved as you see fit. Responsibilities could include:

- Recruit members and run meetings of the Neighborhood Watch Working Group
- Act as a liaison with our Austin Police Department (APD) District Representative
- Coordinate activities and sharing information with other nearby neighborhood watch leaders (such as Crestview and Allandale)
- Attend APD Commander's Forum meetings
- Create reports of local crime statistics and trends
- Raise awareness of criminal activity and crime prevention by conducting regular training sessions
- Lead local National Night Out
- Coordinate with the city about the placement of neighborhood watch signs every year (including grant approval and property owner signatures)
- Recruit and support the establishment of neighborhood watch block captains and patrols
- Report on neighborhood watch status and activities on a regular basis to the neighborhood association

Help prevent crime in Wooten

We have had several incidents in the neighborhood recently. To stay ahead, neighbors must be vigilant and aware, and call the police when they see something suspicious.

At the core of a successful Neighborhood Watch program is getting know your neighbors—starting with those who live on each side of you and the three across the street. Become familiar with their vehicles, schedules and frequent visitors so you'll recognize out-of-the-norm activity around their homes.

If you see anything suspicious, **call 911** immediately. Don't be shy. APD relies on us to be their eyes and ears and to call when we see something suspicious.

Train yourself to note details:

- **Personal:** gender, race, age, height, weight, hair color, facial hair, clothing
- **Vehicle** if present: make, model, color, license plate number and any other distinguishing marks such as dents or broken lights
- **Direction:** which way did they go when leaving the scene?

Several common sense reminders:

- Lock your doors as soon as you get into the car. When arriving home, survey your surroundings before getting out of your car.
- Don't leave exposed valuables in your car. Remember, **LOCK, TAKE and HIDE.**
- Keep your home's doors and windows locked, especially during cooler weather or if you've had people working in your home. Lock backyard gates. Make sure storage sheds are locked and garage doors aren't left up when you're not outside.
- Don't display your valuables from the street. Keep your blinds and curtains closed, especially when you're away and at night when lights are on inside the house.

NeighborWood free tree program

Wooten was chosen for eligibility in the free tree program to help shade our streets and sidewalks. If Tree Folks left a flag in your yard and an order form on your front door, be sure to reserve your tree and commit to watering it.

Victor's flora and fauna

Ever notice those chirping sounds at night—short, squeaky chirps? The culprits are small frogs called cliff chirping frogs, *Eleutherodactylus marnockii*. Cliff chirping frogs are native to the Hill Country and the Edwards Plateau.

They prefer limestone habitats with cracks and crevices where they can hide and access adequate moisture. They're attracted to springs, but not rivers, lakes, and ponds. Recently, they seem to have been expanding their range within the Austin city limits, taking advantage of moisture provided by homeowners who maintain their yards.

Unlike many other frogs, they don't require pooled water for their eggs—merely adequate moisture. They will breed throughout the year except the coldest winter months. Other amphibians in our area include various frogs, toads, and salamanders (see herpssoftexas.org).

Recent rains notwithstanding, Texas has a long way to go to make up for our persistent drought. We're still under Stage 2 restrictions for water use, and population continues to grow.

Here are some ways to protect the green in your yard and your house's foundation in drought and deluge:

- Landscape/xeriscape with drought-tolerant perennials, annuals and grass
- Keep your foundation watered, and install root barriers to protect it from water-seeking tree roots
- Install gutters and rain barrels to prevent our occasional downpours from eroding the soil.
